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**Notice Regarding Execution of Supplemental Agreement with  
the European Space Agency (ESA)**

ispace, inc. (“ispace”) hereby announces that, at a meeting of its Board of Directors held on July 23, 2026, it resolved that its consolidated subsidiary in Luxembourg, ispace EUROPE S.A. (“ispace EUROPE”), will enter into a supplemental agreement with the European Space Agency (“ESA”) in relation to the Mission for Advanced Geophysics and Polar Ice Exploration (“MAGPIE”), with a total value of EUR 65 million, as described below.

Note: As ESA is an intergovernmental organization, certain items including capital, major shareholders and shareholding ratios, and financial condition and operating results for the most recent three fiscal years are not disclosed.

2. Overview of MAGPIE and ispace’s Role

MAGPIE is a lunar exploration mission promoted by ESA, primarily aimed at exploring and characterizing volatile deposits in the lunar polar regions, as well as searching for water ice.

ESA applies phased contract structures for large-scale development contracts involving advanced technologies and long development periods, depending on the phase of each project. (\*1) On December 12, 2024, ispace EUROPE entered into a Pre-Phase A contract with ESA to assess the feasibility, design and mission architecture of MAGPIE. Subsequently, in June 2025, ispace EUROPE entered into an amendment to expand the Pre-Phase A contract to Phase 1. Under Phase 1, ispace EUROPE has led the implementation

of the mission concept, including payload maturation, interface development and prototype manufacturing.

ispace EUROPE will now enter into a supplemental agreement with ESA for Phase 2 of MAGPIE, covering the development, manufacture, operation and transportation of the rover, for a total amount of EUR 65,000,000. Under this agreement, ispace EUROPE will lead the development of the rover, which is planned to be carried as a payload on ispace's Mission 4, scheduled for launch in 2029.

ispace EUROPE leads the consortium involved in this mission, which includes the Technical University of Munich (Germany), the Centre for Space Sensors and Systems at the University of Oslo (Norway), RAL Space (United Kingdom), ESR Technology (United Kingdom), the Institute of Experimental and Applied Physics at the Czech Technical University in Prague (Czech Republic), and The Open University (United Kingdom).
